MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF BIG BEAR MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT HELD ON THURSDAY, JUNE 18, 2009

CALL TO ORDER

President Murphy called the Open Session to order at 1:00 PM. Those in attendance included Director Eminger, Director Suhay, Director Smith, Director Fashempour, General Manager Scott Heule, Lake Manager Mike Stephenson, and Board Secretary Vicki Sheppard.

REPORTS

Mr. Heule reported on some promising news regarding State borrowing of local agency property tax revenue. He explained that on Monday the Joint Legislative Committee voted not to suspend Proposition 1A, however he noted that this is not a guarantee it will not ultimately happen as the budget moves through the legislative process. He commented that the Budget and Finance Committee has looked at what might need to happen if 8% or 25% of our tax revenue is "borrowed" by the State. He explained that if this happens the Committee will come back to the Board with recommendations for budget cuts and changes. Mr. Heule reported that he, Mike Stephenson, and Tim Moore met via the internet with ReMetrix on wrapping up the beneficial use map of the lake. He added that the District is on track to submit the mapping to the Regional Water Quality Control Board to meet our obligation from the permits that were issued for the East End Dredge Project. He explained that the map is a 3D electronic model of the lake and will identify beneficial use areas and volume calculations, habitat gains and losses resulting from lake level changes or dredge/fill activities, marina and potential dredge zones, and special use areas. Mr. Heule reported on the TMDL Task Force meeting vesterday. He stated that Tim Moore is working on revising the Lake Management Plan. Mr. Heule reported on an upcoming event, Run the Bear Marathon. He explained that he drafted a letter to the City Planning Division asking them to provide traffic control at each launch ramp entrance to assure safe ingress and egress during the marathon for boaters, fishermen, and day use visitors using the facilities. He added that a provision will also need to be made to assure District staff and emergency personnel can enter and exit the District office parking lot.

Lake Manager Mike Stephenson reported that the lake weed treatment program is going well. He added that dissolved oxygen is the highest he has ever seen at this time of year. He commented that the lake started to stratify the first part of June and then due to the cooler weather it destratified, however the dissolved oxygen is holding high. He stated that water clarity is good and the carp program is helping.

Lake Operations Supervisor, Travis Carroll, introduced two seasonal ramp attendants; Chuck Gormley (1st season) and Dee Ivey (2nd season). He gave some details of their past work experience and thanked them both for their hard work.

Mr. Stephenson introduced several seasonal maintenance employees starting with James Senecal (1st season), Paul Carpenter (2nd season) and Paul Fetterhoff (3rd season). He gave some details of their past work experience and complimented them all for being excellent employees.

Director Suhay reported on the TMDL meeting yesterday commenting that it was a good, informative, and very long meeting.

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF BIG BEAR MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT TRANSFERRING FUNDS UNAPPROPRIATED AS OF JUNE 30, 2009 TO THE DISTRICT'S CONTINGENCY RESERVE ACCOUNT, AFFIRMING INVESTMENT POLICY, APPROVING THE DISTRICT'S BUDGET AND ESTABLISHING THE APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING JULY 1, 2009

Mr. Heule stated that at the June 4th Board meeting a discussion was held to obtain comments regarding the upcoming fiscal year budget. He reported that no changes were suggested at that time however several changes are suggested at this time. Mr. Heule went over each recommended change: page 3, word removal; page 7 number changes reflect new budgeted income; page 8 reflects a few changes to Operating Expenditures adjusting Operating Fund Allocations downward to reflect boat permit sales; page 9 the Revenue pie chart has been changed; page 10 General Fund Revenue, the Administrative section has been adjusted to reflect changes in Operating expenses for boat permit fees that were previously estimated at \$550,000 and are really coming in at around \$465,000; page 18 a forecast amount of \$7,500 was added for Quagga prevention; page 24 the Fiscal Year-end Balances were adjusted. President Murphy recommended that the changes and adjustments be made as reported and a new bound copy of the Budget with the changes be made. Director Suhay asked what the page 18 Quagga prevention was. Mr. Heule stated that it was public education expenses.

Director Suhay moved approval of a Resolution of the board of Directors transferring funds unappropriated as of June 30, 2009 to the District's Contingency Reserve Account, affirming Investment Policy, approving the District's Budget with the recommended changes and adjustments and establishing the Appropriations limit for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2009. Director Fashempour seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF BIG BEAR MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 2008-02 AS IT RELATES TO HEADWALKS

RECOMMMENDATION:

The General Manager, Lake Manager and Operations Committee (Directors Suhay and Murphy) recommend approval of this resolution.

DISCUSSION/FINDINGS:

Over the years headwalks have generated a considerable amount of effort on the part of staff for enforcement, regulation, and permitting. Recently the California Department of Fish and Game has added mitigation requirements and fees. Additionally, more sophisticated CEQA requirements are being imposed than have been required in the past. These added CEQA requirements obligate the District to take on additional obligations as the lead agency, reviewing and approving mitigated negative declarations where a categorical exemption has been adequate in the past. Headwalks by their very nature also create situations that result in steeper gradients on gangways to get from the headwalk to the dock. This is especially true as the lake level declines. There are no structural reasons that a headwalk is essential instead of a simple, less intrusive, gangway attached to private property. The operations Committee has reviewed this issue with staff and has concluded that in the interest of saving District staff time, safety, excessive permitting, and CEQA involvement, headwalks should be eliminated as an option for dock systems. The Operations Committee recommends approval of the resolution amending Resolution 2008-02 as it relates to headwalks.

RESOLUTION NO. 2009-08

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF BIG BEAR MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 2008-02 AS IT RELATES TO HEADWALKS

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BIG BEAR MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT as follows:

Purpose and Scope.

This resolution amends regulations for the placement of headwalks on Big Bear Lake.

2. Amendment: Definitions.

Section 2 of Resolution No.2008-02 is amended and reenacted to read as follows:

"2. Definitions.

The following terms are defined for the purposes of this resolution, unless otherwise apparent from context:

- (a) <u>Adjacent Property</u>: Property above the high water line of Big Bear Lake adjacent to and abutting the shorezone.
 - (b) CEQA: California Environmental Quality Act.
 - (c) <u>District</u>: Big Bear Municipal Water District.
- (d) <u>Headwalk</u>: An uncovered raised walkway constructed on pilings and installed in the Lake bottom to provide pedestrian access to a dock gangway.
- (e) <u>High Water Line</u> or <u>HWL</u>: Historic contour line within Bear Valley at the Bear Valley Dam spillway elevation of 6743.25' (NGVD-29) mean sea level.
 - (f) <u>Lake</u>: Big Bear Lake.
 - (g) <u>Ministerial</u>: Permits associated with the following projects:
- (1) the placement of up to 50 cubic yards of sand or gravel below the high water line, proof of an equal amount of material has been removed, the removal of vegetation and/or willows, the planting of vegetation for slope protection, and the removal of 100 cubic yards of material;
- (2) the placement of up to 50 cubic yards of riprap below the high water line for shoreline erosion control, may or may not require an equal amount of removal depending upon the District's environmental review of the project;
- (3) installation of footing protection for construction of a seawall on private property; and
- (4) construction and installation of a head walk on District property. The standard drawings for the above activities are included in Section XII, Exhibits.
 - (h) MSL: mean sea level.
 - (i) Seawall: shoreline retaining wall.
- (j) Shorezone: lake bottom area below and including elevation 6743.25' (NGVD-29). In some cases, the shorezone may be above elevation 6743.25' (NGVD-29) due to fill, accretion, land subdivisions or other natural or manmade activities."

3. Amendment: Shorezone Classifications.

Section 3 of Resolution No.2008-02 is amended and reenacted to read as follows:

"3. Shorezone Classifications.

- (a) Described below are the three shorezone classifications and the types of alterations permitted within each classification:
- (1) <u>R-Shorezones</u>: are typically adjacent to privately owned residential lakefront property. Motels, hotels, dock clubs or similar residential-oriented lake facilities shall be considered in this classification. No fences, piers, decks, seawalls, <u>leadyables</u> or other permanent structures

may be placed within the shorezone and no part of any structure on the adjacent lakefront property may be cantilevered beyond the high water line.

- (2) <u>CR-Shorezones</u>: are commercial recreation areas which shall be dedicated to providing water-oriented recreation facilities to the general public. Specifically included in this zone are the seventeen commercial boat landing licenses. No fences, piers, decks, seawalls, headwalks or other permanent structures may be placed within the shorezone, and no part of any structure on the adjacent lakefront property may be cantilevered beyond the high water line.
- of public facilities. Shorezone areas in this classification are typically located adjacent to lakefront property owned and maintained by a public agency. Permanent docks, piers, headwalks, seawalls or other permanent structures, with size and other restrictions to be determined on a case by case basis may be allowed within this class. No part of any structure on the adjacent lakefront property may be cantilevered beyond the high water line.
 - (4) In each of the above classifications, the following projects shall be

allowed:

- (a) Ministerial projects;
- (b) Dredging per attached drawings and specifications;
- (c) Docks or mooring buoys in accordance with dock standards; and
- (d) Steps constructed of reinforced concrete or other District

approved material."

4. Amendment: General Specification and Regulations.

Section 5 of Resolution No.2008-02 is amended and reenacted to read as follows:

"5. General Specifications and Regulations

- (a) No work shall be authorized between December 1st and March 31st of any year in compliance with eagle habitat restrictions, unless otherwise authorized by the appropriate regulatory agency. On any project not completed by November 30th, project proponent shall have implemented District approved erosion control measures as applicable.
- (b) Discharge into the Lake or on the Lake bottom of oil, grease or other lubricants, hydraulic fluid or similar chemicals is specifically prohibited. All appropriate measures shall be taken to prevent such substances from reaching the Lake.
- (c) Use of herbicides or other toxic substances as part of a shorezone alteration project is prohibited.
- (d) The District's routine lake maintenance activities shall be exempt from the provisions of these standards. Routine lake maintenance activities include but are not limited to: aquatic weed management, debris removal, emergency erosion control, beach replenishment, dock removal and removal of hazards to navigation.
- (e) No project shall be considered that results in a net loss of lake storage capacity or surface acres, unless the District determines there is an overriding public benefit.
- (f) Any material placed as part of any shorezone alteration shall not contain asphalt, toxic substances, excessive organic material or any substance that would adversely affect the water quality.
- (g) During construction, shorezone alteration projects may be required to provide access to the shoreline for lake maintenance vehicles and equipment.
- (h) The applicant for a shorezone alteration permit may be required to present a legal record of survey showing the lakeside boundary of the property to the altered. In these cases, permanent monuments shall be set for the lakeside boundaries by a licensed civil engineer or surveyor.
- (i) In an emergency situation, shoreline protection may be accomplished only through the temporary placement of sandbags or other District approved means until such time as an appropriate project can be developed and approved.

- (j) In many reaches of the shorezone of Big Bear Lake, sewer systems owned by public agencies exist. The design of any shorezone alteration project shall consider the location and depth of any sewer line and or manholes when designing a project.
- (k) A prime concern of the District is a workable compromise between the private property rights of the lake front property owner and the right of access to the lake by the general public. Public accessibility to the particular stretch of shoreline before and after a project will be evaluated. No shorezone alteration project shall be approved if it results in a significant reduction in access by the general public to the affected portion of the Lake."

5. Amendment: Specifications and Standard Drawings

Section 6 of Resolution No.2008-02 is amended and reenacted to read as follows:

"6. Specifications and Standard Drawings

- (a) Dredging and Erosion Control:
- (1) Dredge projects shall typically be designed in conformance with the attached Exhibit "A", in which dredging to the finish elevation of 6728' (NGVD-29) is recommended. However, projects shall be evaluated on a case-by-case basis, taking into consideration the topography and geography of the area, economics and access. Dredging to elevation 6728' (NGVD-29) or any other elevation does not guarantee the ability to navigate in perpetuity due to historic fluctuations of the Lake level;
- (2) The quantity of all material either placed in or removed from the Lake shall be recorded daily and reported in writing to the District weekly;
- (3) The recommended slopes are 3:1. However, other slopes will be considered after reviewing the direction of the prevailing winds and topography. The final protective covering shall be placed as soon as possible after the final slope is established. Slope protection shall be placed before December 1st of each year;
- (4) Each applicant shall be given the most recent contour map of Big Bear Lake for use as a guideline to design the project. However, it is the responsibility of the applicant to verify the current depths and distances in the project area when designing the project;
- facilities exist. Generally the manholes are set at elevation 6744' (NGVD-29) plus. The topography over the sewer line and around the manholes is often below elevation 6744' (NGVD-29). The project may be designed to fill the that area to a distance of five feet into the Lake from the centerline of the manhole or sewer line, providing property is protected with rock riprap as per Exhibit "B" and also provided no permanent structures are installed on fill area. The fill area shall remain open for public access and may be planted with natural vegetation to protect against erosion. As per the drawing, the top of the dredged slope shall begin a minimum of five feet toward the Lake from the sewer line or center line of the manhole;
- (6) Rock riprap, 12" or greater in diameter, or District approved substitute, shall be placed as shown on Exhibit "A" over an approved filter fabric material stapled in place, to elevation 6744' (NGVD-29). The bottom elevation shall be 6728' (NGVD-29), or the finish grade of dredging;
- (7) No work shall be allowed in the water until a satisfactory silt curtain is installed in place surrounding that portion of the project within the Lake. This restriction shall apply during the construction and the removal of coffer dams. The silt curtain shall be capable of withstanding wind and wave action reasonably expected at the site. The silt curtain shall be inspected in place by District personnel prior to the start of construction and prior to its removal upon final acceptance of a project;
- (8) Any material removed from dredge site shall be transported in such a manner as to preclude leakage of material onto roadway;
- (9) Construction of new private launch ramps or reconstruction of existing private launch ramps is prohibited.
 - (b) Seawall footing protection specifications (Typical drawing shown on Exhibit "D"):
- (1) Seawalls constructed on private property for the purpose of keeping that property from eroding into the Lake shall be built per applicable building codes;


(2) The footing of the wall shall be constructed below elevation 6743.25' (NGVD-29) and on original or compacted ground; The protection shall consist of two feet by two feet (2' X 2') minimum excavation at the bottom of the wall adjacent to the footing. After lining the excavation with an approved filter material, it shall be backfilled with twelve inch or larger rock. Head Walk specifications (Typical drawing shown on Exhibit "E") (c) Class "PR" shorezone areas: A head walk shall be no more than 3 feet in width, shall be (a) placed perpendicular to the shore, and shall extend no more than 24 feet beyond the lakeside boundary of applicant's property. In the event the applicant's lakeside property boundary is located below the existing high water line, the head walk shall not extend more than 24 feet beyond the existing high water line; Any access steps to the head walk shall be included in the calculation of the 24 feet maximum; (c) Steel pilings or plastic pilings with a steel core, approved by the District, shall be driven into the Lake bottom and shall not be anchored in concrete; A head walk shall have guardrails; (d) (e) The opening to the gangway shall be gated whenever the dock system is removed; **(f)** A head walk shall be uncovered; The deck portion of the head walk shall be no higher than (g) elevation 6,745' (NGVD-29); (h) A head walk shall meet applicable building code requirements." 6. Amendment: Violations. Section 12 is added to Resolution No.2008-02 to read as follows: "12. Violations Any person who violates any provisions of this resolution is guilty of an infraction. Such person is guilty of a separate offense for each and every day during any portion of which any violation of these standards is committed, or continued by such person, firm or corporation, and shall be punishable. The District may also seek civil remedies including any injunctive relief which might be appropriate." 7. Amendment: Exhibits. Section 13 is added to Resolution No.2008-02 to read as follows: "13.Standard Drawings. Standards for shorezones alteration are shown on attached Exhibits." 8. Other Except as provided herein, Resolution No. 2008-02 is affirmed and readopted.



TYPICAL HEAD WALK



RECOMMENDATION:

The General Manager, Lake Manager and Operations Committee (Directors Suhay and Murphy) recommend approval of this resolution.

DISCUSSION/FINDINGS:

There has been some recent confusion by dock builders regarding the permissible length of the combination slip and headway. Dock specifications do not specify in the text a maximum length but the graphics included in the resolution identify the maximum length to be 30 feet. Several sets of dock plans have been rejected recently because they show dock lengths exceeding the 30 foot maximum. In order to stay within the 30 foot maximum length, the 26 foot maximum length slip only allows for a four foot wide headway. A dock builder has asked the District to allow a total length of 32 feet, 26 feet for the slip and six feet for the headway. The accompanying resolution amends dock specifications and clearly defines the maximum dock length as 32 feet both in text and in the diagram example. The Operations Committee recommends the Board approve the resolution amending Resolution 2003-02 as it relates to commercial marina and private dock specifications.

RESOLUTION NO. 2009-09

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF BIG BEAR MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT AMENDING RESOLUTION 2003-02 AS IT RELATES TO COMMERCIAL MARINA AND PRIVATE DOCK SPECIFICATIONS

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF BIG BEAR MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT as follows:

1. Purpose.

This resolution amends district regulations concerning maximum dock length.

2. Amendment: Dock Size Restrictions.

Section I of Resolution No.2003-02 is amended and reenacted to read as follows:


I. "I. SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL DOCK SIZE RESTRICTIONS

- A. No dock shall be licensed or placed on Big Bear Lake until construction plans have been submitted to the District for plan check and approval has been given.
- **B.** Dock components shall be constructed within the size restrictions described below:

C. Minimums and maximums for all residential docks

- 1. Rectangular docks shall be at least six (6) feet wide;
- 2. Fingers shall be at least three (3) feet wide, but no more than fourteen (14) feet wide;
- 3. Gangways shall be at least thirty (30) inches wide, but no more than forty-eight (48) inches wide, with a maximum slope of 3:1 (horizontal to vertical)
- 4. Slip shall be no more than twenty-six (26) feet long;
- 5. Slip divider shall be no more than six (6) inches wide;
- 6. Headway shall be no less than four (4) feet and no more than fourteen (14) feet wide.

Example to illustrate Section III parts D and E.



D. Residential parcels with lake frontage of fifty (50) feet or more may construct a dock as follows:

- Dock width cannot exceed parcel's lake frontage and dock length cannot exceed 32 feet as measured from the end of the finger to the outside edge of the headway
- 2. One (1) slip dock
 - a. Outside perimeter shall not exceed 702 square feet.
 - b. Footprint square footage shall not exceed 489 square feet.
- 3. Two (2) slip dock
 - a. Outside perimeter shall not exceed more 1,056 square feet.
 - b. Footprint square footage shall not exceed 653 square feet.
- 4. Three (3) slip dock
 - a. Outside perimeter shall not exceed 1,440 square feet.
 - b. Footprint square footage shall not exceed 750 square feet.
- 5. Platform dock (no slips)
 - a. Outside perimeter shall not exceed 300 square feet
 - b. No dimension shall exceed thirty (30) feet.
- 6. T/L-shaped dock
 - a. Outside perimeter shall not exceed 832 square feet.
 - b. Footprint square footage shall not exceed 515 square feet.
 - c. Each side tie area shall be a minimum of eight (8) feet wide and sixteen (16) feet long.

E. Residential parcels with lake frontage of more than twenty-five (25) feet and less than fifty (50) feet may construct a dock as follows:

- Dock width cannot exceed parcel's lake frontage and dock length cannot exceed 32 feet as measured from the end of the finger to the outside edge of the headway
- 2. One (1) slip dock
 - a. Outside perimeter shall not exceed 702 square feet.
 - b. Footprint square footage shall not exceed 489 square feet.
- 3. Two (2) slip dock
 - a. Outside perimeter shall not exceed more 1,056 square feet.
 - b. Footprint square footage shall not exceed 653 square feet.
- 4. Platform dock (no slips)
 - a. Outside perimeter shall not exceed 300 square feet
 - b. No dimension shall exceed thirty (30) feet.
- 5. T/L-shaped dock
 - a. Outside perimeter shall not exceed 832 square feet.
 - b. Footprint square footage shall not exceed 515 square feet.
 - c. Each side tie area shall be a minimum of eight (8) feet wide and sixteen (16) feet long.

F. Residential parcels with lake frontage of twenty-five (25) feet or less may construct a dock as follows:

- 1. T, L or U-shaped dock
 - a. No wider than sixteen (16) feet;

- b. No longer than thirty (30) feet;
- c. Finger shall be a minimum of sixteen (16) feet long and four (4) feet wide;
- d. Side tie areas shall be no less than four (4) feet wide.

Platform dock

- a. No wider than six (6) feet;
- b. No longer than thirty (30) feet.
- 3. No modular additions (i.e. PWC ramp) shall be allowed outside the slip area of docks in this category.

G. Residential easement docks

- 1. When up to two parcels share easement dock privileges, they may construct and share a T, L, U-shaped, or platform dock
 - a. T-shaped dock,
 - i. No wider than sixteen (16) feet;
 - ii. No longer than twenty-six (26) feet;
 - iii. Headway no less than four (4) feet wide and no more than six (6) feet wide;
 - iv. The side tie areas shall be no less than four (4) feet wide;
 - v. The fingers shall be no less than four (4) feet wide
 - b. L-shaped dock,
 - i. No wider than sixteen (16) feet;
 - ii. No longer than twenty-six (26) feet;
 - iii. Headway no less than four (4) feet wide and no more than six (6) feet wide;
 - iv. The fingers shall be no less than four (4) feet wide.
 - c. U-Shaped Dock
 - i. No wider than sixteen (16) feet;
 - ii. No longer than twenty-six (26) feet;
 - iii. Headway no less than four (4) feet wide and no more than six (6) feet wide;
 - d. Platform dock
 - i. No wider than six (6) feet;
 - ii. No longer than twenty-six (26) feet.
- 2. When 3 or more parcels share easement dock privileges, they may construct a dock system with one (1) slip per parcel.
 - a. Fingers shall be three (3) feet wide;
 - b. Headways shall be four (4) feet wide;
 - c. Slips shall be no less than eight (8) feet and no more than ten (10) feet wide and no less than sixteen (16) feet and no more than twenty-six (26) feet long.

No modular additions (i.e. PWC ramp) shall be allowed outside the slip area of docks in this category."

3. Other.

Except as provided herein, Resolution No.2003-02 is reaffirmed and readopted.
