# MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF BIG BEAR MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT HELD ON THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 2, 2010

## CALL TO ORDER

President Fashempour called the Open Session to order at 1:00 PM. Those in attendance included Director Eminger, Director Murphy, Director Smith, Director Suhay, District Counsel Wayne Lemieux, General Manager Scott Heule, and Board Secretary Vicki Sheppard.

#### REPORTS

Mr. Heule reported that Lake Manager Mike Stephenson was able to purchase a Volvo backhoe for the District at the auction in Phoenix for \$55K (\$60K with taxes). He explained that it has everything we wanted on it and only has 358 hours. He added that we will be sending our old tractor out on the truck that brings the new one to us explaining that we should get a better price on the old tractor by selling it in Arizona because of the California restrictions on emissions. Director Smith explained that the new backhoe (because it is EPA compliant) will allow us to keep our forklift (that is not compliant) because they look at the overall equipment fleet emissions, not the individual pieces of equipment. Mr. Heule reported that the Department of Safety of Dams inspected the dam on Wednesday morning adding that they instructed the District via Jim Weber to cut some willows in the downstream portions of the bays and asked again about surfacing the face of the dam. He added that Mr. Weber explained that once the old bridge is removed the District will install the last of the service spillway gates in bay 10. Director Smith asked if the District was allowed to cut willows. Mr. Heule explained that if Safety of Dams orders it, we have to comply. He added that we have marked up the final plans for the gasoline remediation trench at Big Bear Marina explaining that staff will begin preparing the paperwork necessary to advertise the construction work. Mr. Heule reported that the City Engineering Department has been helpful in providing language for the plans explaining what permits and inspections will be required to be obtained from them. He explained that the construction of this trench needs to be completed as soon as possible after Labor Day explaining that we have some concerns about groundwater interfering with the trench excavation. Mr. Heule explained that Mike Stephenson will do a test excavation prior to the bidding process so that bidders can anticipate what conditions will be like. He added that the costs associated with this effort will be reimbursed from the State Underground Tank fund. Mr. Heule reported that maintenance staff has started applying Green Kleen Pro to kill some blue green algae that was first observed on Tuesday. He explained that areas in Boulder Bay Marina, Metcalf Bay, near the dam, and Eagles Knoll Estates have already been treated. He added that the algae was observed behind Community Church in Pine Knot Marina, and from new Ski Beach west almost to B's dog park and will be treated today. Mr. Heule explained that toxins produced by the algae can cause gastrointestinal sickness in humans and has been known to kill dogs and other small animals that ingest enough adding that one of the risks for dogs is after swimming in the blue green algae infested water they lick their fur dry. He stated that from this point forward any Blue Green algae Staff observes will be treated. He added that a press release might be prepared early next week if the Blue Green algae concentrations become worse explaining that the release will note the potential human and canine health risks, inform concerning its typical growth pattern this time of

year, and indicating the District Lake Management efforts are directed towards reducing nutrient loads in Lake water that support the algae growth. He reported the Lake level 3.93 feet from full release is 1.83 cfs measured at Station B below the dam. He added that Don Evenson's estimate that the release schedule will result in a 4 foot lake level by Labor Day is right on. Mr. Heule reported that he and Mr. Evenson are working on a release policy for Muni's Lake Emergency Storage based on the ability of Edison to divert flows and a reasonable ramp up/down that we could justify to Fish & Game and USFS. He added that the maximum release rate would probably be in the range of 40 to 70 cfs with ramp downs on the order of 2 to 10 cfs/day to protect fish from being stranded. Mr. Heule showed photos provided by Director Eminger of the new bridge project.

# FOUNDATION AD HOC COMMITTEE PRESENTATION ON POSSIBLE MWD FOUNDATION – DISCUSSION ONLY, NO ACTION

Mr. Heule explained that the Ad Hoc Committee (Directors Suhay and Murphy) appointed by President Fashempour would want the MWD Foundation to be solely organized for special project fund raising and to provide volunteer services for some of the Districts educational and special events such as Kool Kids, Carp Roundup, and shoreline cleanup. He added that their fundraising would be focused on fisheries and maybe even grant-funding for District Capital projects. He reported that the Committee is thinking that each Director would select two individuals from their district to appoint to the Board of Directors and the Foundation Board members would need to be approved by the entire MWD Board. Mr. Heule reported that terms of appointment would be two years and their by-laws would indicate they would operate under the obligations of the Brown Act. He added that monthly meetings would be attended by the General Manager and one Director appointed by the Board President. He reported that the bylaws would clearly indicate that the Foundation would operate within a very narrowly defined role and would have no input regarding management or policies of the District. He explained that District Counsel Wayne Lemieux indicated that his firm will draft the documents necessary for incorporation as a non-profit pro-bono but that the filing and accounting expenses associated with the organization should be raised and funded by the Foundation itself. He added that Mr. Lemieux estimates this will amount to about \$1,500 explaining that the Foundation will also need to secure some Directors Liability Insurance as well. Mr. Heule stated that if the Board wants to continue pursuing the Foundation concept the Committee would need to prepare a single page explanation describing the purpose and scope of work for the Foundation Directors that can be used to recruit community members who are known and can influence others to donate. Director Suhay explained that this would not be a Citizens Advisory Group but would just be for fund-raising with a sole purpose to get money for specific projects and events. President Fashempour stated that she was thinking it was for raising money and then the foundation would decide how to spend it. Mr. Heule stated that the foundation would raise money for specific projects determined by the District. Director Eminger stated that he would

like to use Big Bear residents and not go for a grant writer from outside Big Bear. Director Smith commented that he would agree to it if the fundraising was for specific events such as Kool Kids. Director Suhay stated that the foundation would also be to recruit volunteers to help work at specific events such as Kool Kids. President Fashempour commented that she thought that was a good idea. District Counsel Lemieux stated that when directed to proceed, they will work on the by-laws and then present them to the Committee and if the Committee decides to approve the draft then they will be presented to the full Board. He also explained that a name for the Foundation would have to be decided. President Fashempour commented that she likes the name "Friends of the Lake". Director Eminger stated that the Board doesn't need to make a decision today but just to assure that everyone is in agreement to proceed. Director Smith commented that considering the economy, it might be hard to get money donations at this time but if this foundation increases chances of getting volunteers for events he is okay with it. Director Suhay explained that part of their job would be to get the front money for maintenance of the program as well. Director Murphy commented that there would be no guarantee that they could get the money. Director Suhay commented that he believes the people who might be interested in being associated with the foundation would have the time and resources to do the job. Mr. Lemieux added that he believes that people know that those who volunteer would rather help with a nonprofit agency than a government agency. Mr. Heule stated that we should probably schedule another Ad- Hoc Committee meeting and flush out ideas before we ask Mr. Lemieux to get started on the by-laws.

He added that the East Ramp hours will not change. Director Suhay commented that perhaps we should issue a press release on the new hours. Mr. Heule stated that the information has been changed on our website and is also being given out answering phones. He added that the Grizzly and KBHR will be contacted as well.

Director Eminger commented that it has been a good season with the lake being up from last year adding that staff has done an excellent job.

## **RECOMMMENDATION:**

The General Manager and the Watershed/Lake Improvement Committee recommend approval

# DISCUSSION/FINDINGS:

The District is the lead agency on any project proposed for the shorezone or lake bottom alteration. Gary Hybl proposes to build a 90 foot long seawall at the Lake edge on his property at 39342 Aurora Road on the northwest side of Metcalf Bay. Hybl submitted a biological review of the site in January 2010 along with a draft notice of exemption from CEQA. The District turned the report and document over to Tom Dodson and Associates for review and advice. They concluded that before the District should accept the work the biological review should be conducted when the site was not covered in snow. A second survey was done in June 2010 and report prepared on July 12, 2010. The materials were again submitted for review by Tom Dodson and Associates and on July 19 they advised the District that based on the more recent biological survey and proposed work a categorical exemption (CE) from review under CEQA is the appropriate document for this work under section 15303, "New construction or conversion of small structures". The applicant has prepared all documentation needed for the District to process the Categorical Exemption and file the Notice of Exemption (see attached). The Committee recommends that the Board make the finding that the Hybl seawall falls within the category defined for the exemption from review under CEQA and move to file the notice of exemption with the County of San Bernardino.

#### HYBL SEAWALL PROJECT DESIGN FEATURES

## **BIOLOGICAL RESOURCES**

- BR-1: Obtain permits that provide for mitigation of significant impacts, from the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE), the California Department of Fish and Game (CDFG), and the Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB), as required by those agencies, to allow construction of the seawall within Big Bear Lake and minimize impacts to the lake.
- **BR-2:** Construction equipment shall not be operated in the water.
- BR-3: Any temporary dam or artificial obstruction shall only be built from sandbags which will cause little or no siltation.
- **BR-4:** Spoil sites shall not be located within the lake, where spoil could be washed back into the lake or where it could cover aquatic or riparian vegetation.
- **BR-5:** Areas of disturbed soil which slope toward the lake shall be stabilized to reduce erosion potential by planting and seeding with native plants.
- **BR-6:** If the lake margin or the gradient has been altered, it shall be returned as nearly as possible to pre-project conditions without creating a future bank erosion problem.
- **BR-7:** The Contractor shall install adequate control devices to ensure that turbidity or siltation resulting from project related activities does not constitute a threat to aquatic life. Passage of sediment beyond any sediment barrier shall be prohibited.
- BR-8: Access to the work site shall be via existing driveways.

# **CULTURAL RESOURCES**

#### **Executive Summary**

Sage Environmental Group was contracted by Mr. Gary Hybll to conduct a biological assessment for the construction of a 90 linear foot sea wall along the lake frontage at 39342 Aurora Road, Big Bear, California. This biological assessment focuses on identifying sensitive species potentially present in or around the subject property and the potential effects of the sea wall to affect those resources. The assessment was required as part of the Big Bear Municipal Water District (District) application process for the sea wall. Construction of the sea wall will reduce ongoing erosion and siltation along and within Big Bear Lake at this location.

The project site is located on the south side of Big Bear Lake, north of Big Bear Boulevard (State Route 18). It is on Aurora Road on the west side of Metcalf Bay. There is extensive documentation of several rare plant and animals species found along and on the Metcalf and Boulder Bay peninsulas, and in particular Metcalf Bay meadows and lowlands.

A data review was conducted to provide information on plant and wildlife species known to be present in the vicinity of the project site. Other available technical information on the biological resources of the site was also reviewed.

Two general biological assessments were conducted of the project site, the first on December 16, 2009 and the second on June 4, 2010. All species identified by sight, call or sign (burrows, scat, tracks, etc.) were recorded. Site photographs were taken with a digital camera. A jurisdictional waters determination was also conducted.

The field work included searching for sensitive species identified by the City of Big Bear Lake, the California Department of Fish and Game and the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The assessment included the identification of plant species and plant cover on the property to determine habitat suitability for sensitive species.

Of the sensitive species potentially present on site, suitable habitat for the bald eagle and bat species was identified. The trees around the project site and the local residential neighborhood provide suitable roosting habitat for the bald eagle as and bat species. Because the project is in an area already impacted by residential development, the proposed construction of a seawall is not expected to have significant impacts to the bald eagle or bat species.

The site lies at the boundary of the Ordinary High Water Mark (OHWM) of Big Bear Lake and therefore, comes under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army Corps (Corps), Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB), California Department of Fish and Game (CDFG). The project proponent will need to contact the Corps, RWQCB and the CDFG to determine what permits and mitigation, if any, will be required.

Impacts to raptors and migratory birds are not expected to be significant. The seawall will be constructed on a residential property in an existing residential neighborhood. There will be no increase in noise or human activity once the seawall is constructed.

No wildlife corridors exist, and habitat fragmentation has already occurred.

#### 1.0 Introduction

# 2.0 Project Locality and Description

The project site is located on the south side of Big Bear Lake, north of Big Bear Boulevard (State Route 18). It is on Aurora Road on the west side of Metcalf Bay (Figures 1 and 2).

The project site lies in the western half of Section 24, Township 2 north, Range 1 west, on the Big Bear Lake 7.5' U. S. Geological Survey (USGS) quadrangle, San Bernardino base and meridian.

The proposed project is construction of a 90 foot-long seawall to reduce ongoing erosion and siltation along and within Big Bear Lake at this location.

#### 3.0 Methods

#### 3.1. Research

A data search was conducted to provide information on plant and wildlife species known occurrences within the vicinity. This review included biological texts on general and specific biological resources, and those resources considered to be sensitive by various wildlife agencies, local governmental agencies and interest groups. The documents reviewed include:

- List of sensitive biological resources provided by the California Natural Diversity Data Base.
- Biological resources report for this site and adjacent properties.
- General texts and other documents identifying potential resources on the property.

The results of the data search and assessment are provided in Appendix A.

Other available technical information on the biological resources of the site and vicinity were also reviewed. We used the information to focus our survey efforts in the field.


Sensitive species identified as potentially present on site include those listed, or candidates for listing by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), California Department of Fish and Game (CDFG), and California Native Plant Society (CNPS).

## 3.2 Field Surveys

General assessment field surveys were conducted by Ms. Karen Kirtland on December 16, 2009 and Ms Alissa Cope on June 4, 2010. The property was surveyed using standard survey techniques for general biological assessments. A general reconnaissance level survey was walked throughout the site on both dates. The entire project site and adjacent area was evaluated for suitable habitat for sensitive species, as well as the presence of protected resources such as streams and drainages.


In December, the site had recently been covered in snow (Photo 1). Ms. Kirtland dug down to the soil cover at various points within the project site and the surrounding area to determine the soil and plant cover underneath the snow (Photo 2). In June, the site contained typical spring/summer plant cover (Photo 3 and Photo 4).

Seawall Construction Project 39342 Aurora Road





Map Base: Big Bear Lake (1996) 7.5' USGS topographic quadrangle




Photo 3. Sea wall alignment in June looking east.

#### 4.0 Results

# 4.1 Weather, Topography, and Soils

During the December survey, the weather was cool, in the low fifties degrees Fahrenheit, with clear skies and a mild wind (two to three miles per hour) from the west. During the June survey, the weather was warm, in the low eighty degrees Fahrenheit, with clear skies and calm (wind less than one mile per hour from the west).

The topography of the site is flat, with a shallow slope (less than one percent) downhill from southeast to northwest (Figure 1, Photo 5 and Photo 6). The soils are a unconsolidated sandy granitic soil, typical of the Big Bear Lake area (Photo 7 and Photo 8).




Photo 5. Slope of site down to Metcalf Bay in December.




Photo 7. Sandy granitic soil surface in December.

## RECOMMMENDATION:

The General Manager and the Foundation Ad-Hoc Committee recommend that the Board direct the Ad-Hoc Committee and District Counsel to begin preparing the Foundation paperwork

#### DISCUSSION/FINDINGS:

The Committee reviewed a draft white paper describing objectives, duties and operation of a future MWD Foundation. A second draft of the paper is attached (version 9/13/10). The Committee indicates that the MWD Board should be looking to appoint Foundation Directors who are high caliber, quality people, who can and will bring their energy and expertise to support the programs and policies of the Big Bear Municipal Water District through volunteer work and fundraising. The Committee recommends that each Board member submit a prioritized list of three or four potential candidates from their Division who they believe would make good Foundation Directors to the General Manager. The lists would be compiled and then distributed to the full Board for their consideration. After the full Board approves a list of up to ten candidates, Board members will ask their nominees to become members of the Foundation Board. If the approach that the MWD Foundation Ad-Hoc Committee has proposed is acceptable they recommend authorizing District Council to draft Foundation By-Laws and 501(C) 3 Non-profit filing paperwork. Once the By-Laws have been prepared and conceptually approved by the MWD Board the Foundation Board would be asked to select a name and review and suggest any edits or modifications to the By-Laws for consideration by the MWD Board.

# Rough Draft 09-13-10

The Mission of the MWD Foundation is to support the policies and priorities of the Big Bear Municipal Water District through: public education, volunteer support, fundraising and development, and key project financial support.

- 1. The purpose of the MWD Foundation will be to:
  - a. Provide volunteers as needed for District special events such as Kool Kids, Shoreline Cleanup and Carp Roundup
  - b. Raise funds and write grant applications for MWD Board approved projects such as capital improvements, fisheries, invasive species control/protection
- The MWD Foundation Board of Directors will be appointed by the MWD Board of Directors, two
  from each MWD Division (up to ten) for two year terms and will serve the interests of the MWD
  Board of Directors and MWD policies, priorities and regulations.
- 3. The Foundation Board meetings will be conducted transparently in accordance with the State of California Brown Act rules for meeting notices, agendas etc.
- 4. The Foundation Board will elect or appoint officers including but not limited to President, Vice President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer. Foundation Board can form subcommittees to accomplish certain tasks such as shoreline cleanup, Quagga inspections, launch ramp traffic control etc.
- 5. The Foundation Board is encouraged to develop selection criteria and recruit interested volunteers from the community to assist in carrying out the work of the Foundation.
- 6. The MWD Foundation will provide their own administrative support and will not rely on District office equipment or supplies or employees to carry out their mission.
- 7. Liaison with the MWD Board will be facilitated by one MWD Director appointed by the MWD Board President and the MWD General Manager who will attend monthly Foundation Board meetings. The assigned liaison MWD Board Member and the MWD General Manager will advise the Foundation Board regarding minimum qualifications and performance expectations for volunteers who may take part in District special events and activities.
- 8. The Foundation may reimburse Foundation members for direct expenses incurred as part of their approved activities on behalf of the Foundation. Valid receipts must accompany all reimbursement requests. No compensation, stipend, per diem or other remuneration for service on behalf of the Foundation will be given.
- 9. One of the first tasks for the Foundation Board will be to raise approximately \$2000 to pay the expenses associated with preparing and filing of a 501(c)-3 non-profit foundation incorporation paperwork.
