

BASIC LIMNO EDUCATION

- The limnological report (limno) can help even the most inexperienced fisherman figure out where the fish are hiding! Find a copy of the limno for Big Bear Lake, weekly, starting early spring at www.bbmwd.org.
- 2. The limno is a combination of temps and dissolved oxygen (D.O.) readings throughout the Lake starting from the west and moving east and also from top to bottom.
- 3. In order to fish using the limno, you must know that rainbow trout are very sensitive to both D.O. and water temp. If the oxygen is too low it becomes a life and death situation for the fish.
- 4. Oxygen levels below 5 parts per million is the breaking point for these fish to be stressed.
- 5. The higher the concentration of D.O. the better these fish feel and thrive.
- 6. The optimum temps are around 52° to 58°. Fish in these temps are more active and have a much higher likelihood of being in a feeding pattern.

HOW TO FISH USING THE CHART

- 7. Look at the limno chart to find the D.O. at or greater than 5 parts per million with a temp closest to 54°.
- 8. Remember the temps at the top may be too hot and you need to drop your offering to get in the zone.
- 9. Don't go too deep because the D.O. may run out very quickly.
